Fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday)

"The tax collectors and sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus."

"To err is human, to forgive, divine." So said the Catholic poet and philosopher Alexander Pope. He may have written over 300 years ago, but his ability to distil a great deal of wisdom into few words can speak to our generation in a powerful way. In these words Pope reflects upon the need for forgiveness and understanding in our dealings with others – seeing in them the good and the potential which is truly God given or, as he puts it, "divine". And how do we know this? because we know this is the way God deals with me and with you!

We are very familiar with this story, which is brought to us by the Gospel writer Saint Luke. The phrase "Prodigal Son" has even entered our common parlance; if someone has gone their own way but then returns to a group or a family we will sometimes say "the prodigal returns"... but there is always the outside chance that this is said more in scorn than in gratitude and concern! Here in this story the father is on the lookout for his son who has wandered away from him; he is concerned for him; he loves him and he is always seeking his good. Who knows, he might even have kept an eye on him from a distance just to make sure that he didn't get himself into any trouble which put him in danger! It is hard to know exactly what thoughts and worries were in the Father's heart, but many of us will know something of that "at a distance" care which we have to exercise for others.

The elder boy, the one who has always kept his head down and worked hard for his father, doing everything that was asked of him, is none too impressed when "this son of yours" (notice he does not say "my brother"!) comes back and is feted with such lavish care and attention. "What about me?" you can hear him say. "Don't you recognize that I could have done exactly the same: claimed what was mine, and headed off to find myself on my own? I have had the concern and the constancy of a good and faithful child – but I feel as if it is all taken a little bit for granted and I've not been recognised for what I have done."

The story is a complex one, it circles around the themes of faithfulness and headstrongness – and so we need to remember the situation in which Jesus tells this tale. He encounters amongst the Pharisees and Scribes, those who were well-versed in the Jewish Law and customs, a certain stand-offish attitude when they see

that Jesus "welcomes sinners and eats with them". Now there can be a tendency to think that all Pharisees and Scribes were – and are – bad people; not so. They had a love of God at the heart of what they were trying to do to the best of their ability, but Jesus wants them to see another angle to their faithfulness to God, an angle which will speak of understanding of peoples' weaknesses and sin but the fact that the Father – his Father, God – is always wanting to draw people back into a relationship of love and of care and of real and true family where they will be safe and welcomed. Yes, they will have learned lessons on the way, they will have made their mistakes and taken their wrong turns (which one of us hasn't?), but what will ultimately matter is that "your brother (your sister) here was dead and has come to life; he was lost and is found". Thanks be to God for that!

The forty days of Lent are our opportunity to make a journey in our spiritual life – almost a retreat in everyday life as we accompany those who are preparing to be received into the Church at Easter. Baptism is our vocation to love, in imitation of the Lord Jesus, and on Holy Thursday evening when we gather for the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we will see this lived out very visibly in the washing of the feet – and yet it is lived out every time we gather for Mass, when we hear the words of Jesus, "This is my body given for you, this is my blood poured out for you; do this in memory of me!"
