"She had a sister named Mary who sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak."

St Hildegard of Bingen was born in 1098, but her music is still performed today. She lived at a time when women were expected to conform to society's expectations and to be quiet, particularly in the face of authority. However, she felt driven by her faith to write hymns and anthems, for which she wrote both the music and the words. She was also joyously herself. "Dare to declare who you are", she wrote. "It is not far from the shores of silence to the boundaries of speech." Hildegard saw human beings as "living sparks" of God's love. She was able to see the intricate relationship between humanity, God and the living world. Her music traces this relationship, describing the cosmos in harmony. Women and men, trees, rivers, mountains and stars are all beautifully interwoven. Pope Francis today describes the world as "our common home" and names one of the greatest challenges of modern times as to care for creation. Hildegard of Bingen expressed this in her own way: "The Word is living, being, spirit, all verdant greening, all creativity. This Word manifests itself in every creature."

Today's Gospel follows on from the story of the sending out of the seventy-two, who will take nothing with them and will rely on the hospitality and welcome of the townspeople when they visit. Jesus is preparing his disciples to carry out the message that the kingdom of God is close at hand. He also tells the story of the Good Samaritan, the story of how to be a good neighbour. A good neighbour acts with love towards others, to the extent of feeling their pain deep inside. Today we hear how Jesus himself visits a village and is welcomed by Martha.

Jesus' way of interacting with, and including, women in his circle is very different from the cultural expectations of his time. Though this story is often used to draw our attention to the fact that we can be distracted by our day-to-day life from listening to the message of Christ, there is more to it than that. Here we see Mary, seated at the feet of Jesus, listening to him. As the US bishops remark in their footnotes to this Gospel, "[i]t is remarkable for first-century Palestinian Judaism that a woman would assume the posture of a disciple at the master's feet, and it reveals a characteristic attitude of Jesus towards women in this Gospel". Mary is welcomed and included,

and, as Jesus says, "Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

When we exclude people from our community, our "circle", we lose out on their gifts. Each of us is called to serve, but we each serve in our own way, bringing our special skills, our personality and our way of being and doing. If we tried to build a house by employing only a plumber, we would miss out on the skills and contribution of the electrician and the bricklayer. We need everyone – women and men, boys and girls. Hildegard of Bingen saw everyone as "living sparks" of God's love. Is this how we see others? Or are we a bit anxious or afraid if someone is different from us? Dame Tanni Grey-Thompson, who uses a wheelchair, often explains that she, like anyone else, wants to travel by train, but to be able to do that she needs a ramp and someone to assist her. In August 2024 she was forced to crawl off a train when no one arrived to help. Rather than being accepted and welcomed into normal social life, she was excluded. Jesus welcomed Mary and included her in his circle, although she was a woman and would therefore normally be excluded at that time. How do we make sure we welcome and include everyone in our parish and community, especially those who are usually left out or left behind?

We are called to be welcoming and hospitable to all. We are called to live in harmony with each other and with the rest of creation.
