Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe We "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Luke 23:42

How many films can you think of in which it seems everything is lost and the main characters of the story are going to be defeated, only for a last-minute rescue? There are so many and, even though part of us is expecting it, we continue to rejoice when the day is saved and the cavalry come over the hill.

A few classic examples include Han Solo coming to the rescue of Luke Skywalker at the end of the original *Star Wars* film, just when it looks as though Darth Vader is going to thwart the heroes' plans. Or when the children and grownups are trapped by the Velociraptors at the end of *Jurassic Park*, only to by saved by an unlikely hero – the T-Rex. Again, in *The Lord of the Rings*, in the climactic battle at the fortress of Helm's Deep, when the good forces are about to be overrun by the army of evil Orcs, the wizard Gandalf and the calvary of once-banished Riders of Rohan appear with the sunrise over the crest of a hill to save the day. Or finally, in the *Avengers* movies, when it looks as though Thanos (the big villain) is about to destroy all the forces of good, the once-destroyed army and heroes appear just in time to tip the battle and eventually enable good to triumph. The list goes on and on, but deep within our being is the sense that Good must triumph – that is the way things should be.

In the Gospel today we hear the remarkable last-minute saving of the criminal crucified alongside Jesus. We know nothing of his story except this last-minute reprieve.

How do we feel about them being saved at the last moment? If we knew that with our last breath we could confess our sins, say sorry and be forgiven and welcomed into the eternity of heavenly joy with God – how would we live? If our answer involves doing things which we would consider as sin, we have missed the point of God's wisdom, guidance and commandments. Sin brings death, to us and to others: it hurts everybody, is addictive and its nature is camouflaged in lies of desire. We are encouraged and challenged to love others, simply because it is the best thing for us. We are called to live in the kingdom of God now, here on earth, today, because that is what will truly bring us joy, peace and satisfaction.

If we have ever felt jealous of last-minute conversions, like that of the crucified criminal in the story, we find ourselves like the vineyard workers in the parable,

grumbling about how all the workers are paid the same regardless of how much work they do. Or we find ourselves in the character of the older son in the parable of the prodigal, again complaining about the Father's mercy without realising all that we have. These are not good places to be!

Jesus is our king; as disciples we must submit to his rule and authority. There is something in our human nature that resists this, unless we accept the esteemed status of the ruler and the wisdom and justice of the rules. In Jesus we have the perfect king, and his rule is absolutely wise and just. Remarkably, we are invited to rule with him as part of the Body of Christ. The challenge, then, is to serve and shepherd others, to recognise that as kings, like David, we have a duty to care for them. We are to be the ones who appear when it seems the battle is lost. We are called to be heroes in other people's stories. We are called to bring words and actions of mercy, forgiveness, peace, security, compassion, grace and love into people's lives – even if it costs us our own.
