Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Sunday Year C

Weekday Cycle II

"Zeal for your house will consume me." John 2:17

Today we celebrate the dedication of the Lateran Basilica. Perhaps that might not mean a lot to us, so a little bit of history and geography might be helpful. Probably if we think about the church in Rome, we'll have an image of St Peter's in the Vatican. But however important and imposing St Peter's is, it gives way to a smaller building in Rome, a few kilometres outside the Vatican, the Lateran Basilica. The word "Lateran" comes from the name of an old Roman family who built a palace there. The church itself is the oldest in Rome and dates from the year 324. It was the cathedral for each Bishop of Rome, who was of course, the pope. For centuries the popes lived in the Lateran Palace next door. Although it's had its share of damage and reconstruction over the centuries, the Lateran Basilica is still, if we like to think of it this way, the pope's parish church and it's honoured as the Mother Church of all the churches in the world.

While we must look after our church buildings, of course there's a danger we can forget what they're for. There's a lovely story about St Francis of Assisi, the pope and the Lateran Basilica. In the thirteenth century, when people first joined Francis to follow his way of poverty, there were many so-called religious groups ranging from the heretical to odd cults. Francis wanted to make sure he was on the right path so he went to Rome with his brothers to get the pope's approval. It's said that Pope Innocent III had a dream that the Lateran Basilica was tipping over and a little man in a scruffy religious habit was holding it up on his shoulder. A short while later, a whole group of scruffy men turned up to see him and ask him to approve their way of life. The pope saw the meaning of his parable-dream and approved *The Rule of Life* Francis had written. It wasn't the basilica that needed propping up, but the faith of the people that needed renewing and strengthening.

Today, Remembrance Sunday, it's also important to remember the millions of people who have needed courage and strength to face the horrors of war. St Francis and

his followers were dedicated peacemakers – and there's nothing to stop us following their example. Pope Innocent III dreamed that the Lateran Basilica was about to collapse, and countless people have had a similar devastating experience, but through war. Innocent needed St Francis. Today's troubled world needs us.

In our first reading the prophet Ezekiel has a vision of the water of life flowing from the Temple. It echoes the words Jesus himself spoke in the Temple in Jerusalem "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink." We heard St Paul, exasperated by the factions of the Christians in Corinth, telling them they had drifted from Jesus who was the foundation they were to build on. In the Gospel, John shows us an angry Jesus who is appalled by the blasphemy of God's holy Temple becoming a marketplace and a corrupt one at that.

The Lateran Basilica is adorned with beautiful mosaics depicting Our Lady, Saints Peter and Paul, John the Evangelist, John the Baptist and smaller figures of St Francis and Anthony of Padua – but today, Remembrance Sunday, we pray to and for people who might be uncanonised saints, whose good works are known only to God and to those for whom they literally laid down their lives.

While of course we must look after our church buildings, in one sense they are not important. Whether we're in a sumptuous basilica or in a grass hut with rain dripping onto the simple table that serves as an altar, it is the same Christ our Saviour who offers himself with us to the Father and gives us back his own life in communion.

On Remembrance Sunday it's worth remembering that people's faith in a loving God has helped them to survive war and destruction. God has remained alongside and within his suffering people and those who have fought for peace. With God's help, we can live, we can rebuild, we can look to the future.
